

Mary Cassatt (Pittsburg, 1844, à€“ Chateau de Beaufresne, 1926) Mary est nee a Pittsburgh. Son pere etait un banquier tres liberal en matiere deducation, et toute la famille semblait manifester une certaine sympathie pour la culture francaise. Mary navait pas plus de cinq ou six ans lorsqu'elle vit Paris pour la premiere fois, et elle etait encore adolescente quand elle decida de devenir peintre. Elle se rendit en Italie, puistourna ses pas vers Anvers, pour retourner a Rome et finalement, revenir a Paris, ou, en 1874, elle sinstalla definitivement. En 1872, elle envoya ses premieres oeuvres au Salon ; dautres suivirent jusqu'en 1875, annee ou elle envoya un portrait de sa soeur, qui fut refuse. Elle devina que le jury navait pas aime l'arriere-plan, cest pourquoi elle le retravailla a maintes reprises pour le renvoyer au Salon de l'annee suivante, ou il fut finalement accepte. Elle admirait Manet, Courbet, et Degas, et detestait l'art conventionnel.
