But of late a new kind of resentment against Jews has come out in the open. Unnoticed by much of the outside world, the desire for a finish line that would spell a definitive end to the countrys obsession with the past is feeding an emphasis on German victimhood. Mounk shows how, from the governments pursuit of a less apologetic foreign policy to the way the countrys idea of the Volk makes life difficult for its immigrant communities, a troubled nationalism is shaping Germanys future.
